

Bluey's Stars



Bluey Stars

With your class, negotiate 9 different rewards that the students can choose to receive once they have finished a Bluey's Star chart. This needs to be displayed in the classroom so that the students are aware of what they are working towards. An example of a Bluey's Star Rewards chart is included in this pack, as well as a blank one that can be enlarged and laminated for classroom use.

Explanation

Bluey's Stars is to be a yearly reward system.

1. Children receive one stamp each day for good behaviour given by the classroom teacher on their Bluey's Stars charts.
2. If a student is away then they do not receive a stamp for that day.
3. If a student brings a note in to explain the absence, they receive a stamp for each day they are away.
4. If a student does not behave positively, they do not receive a stamp and the square is not skipped. Their next stamp will continue in the next available square.
5. When a whole sheet is filled, students receive a Bluey Star as a reward.
6. ***80% of students should be completing a sheet in 5 or 6 weeks, if they are displaying the qualities of a safe, respectful learner and are at school every day. By the end of the year, most students should have at least 6 tickets in the Bluey's Best box.***
7. Students also choose a reward from a list on a 9 square grid that is displayed on the classroom wall. Rewards will be a mixture of tangible or activity/time-based and chosen as a whole class in negotiation with the class teacher.
8. The completed star sheet is sent home and a ticket with the child's name is placed in the Bluey Star bin to be drawn in a large prize draw at the end of the term. Children then commence their next Bluey's Star chart.
9. Whole school reward days will occur once each term (about Week 6), by filling Bluey's belly (on a large Bluey, displayed in the playground) with PBL stickers, which can be given to students by any staff member at any time. Classes will also complete a smaller Bluey's Belly in their classroom with a focus to be determined according to data.

Positives:

- A student can't be rewarded for good behaviour if they are not at school, but they can be rewarded for bringing in a note for being away, rather than their non-attendance making them miss out altogether.
- Every student in the school has the opportunity to finish their sheet in whatever timeframe they choose.
- Every student in the school WILL be rewarded at some stage and will always have something to work towards. Every day is a new day with the opportunity to achieve a stamp and reach the end of their sheet.
- Students with high absenteeism will have an incentive to come to school more often. Those who have little control over their attendances will still be rewarded for good behaviour in other ways. E.g. rewards party, prize box, classroom rewards, whole school Bluey's Belly reward etc.
- Students who enrol at school later in the year will start a sheet and have the same opportunity as everyone else to complete their sheet in the minimum 5 week time frame. If they arrive in week 6 Term 4, they will still get a Bluey's belly reward and their sheet will follow them into the next year.

**Stage Reward parties are not associated with Bluey Stars. Stages are to arrange their own criteria for attending reward parties. E.g. Dojo, sticker charts, points table etc. This allows for students with no control over their attendance to be rewarded for their good behaviour in other ways.*
